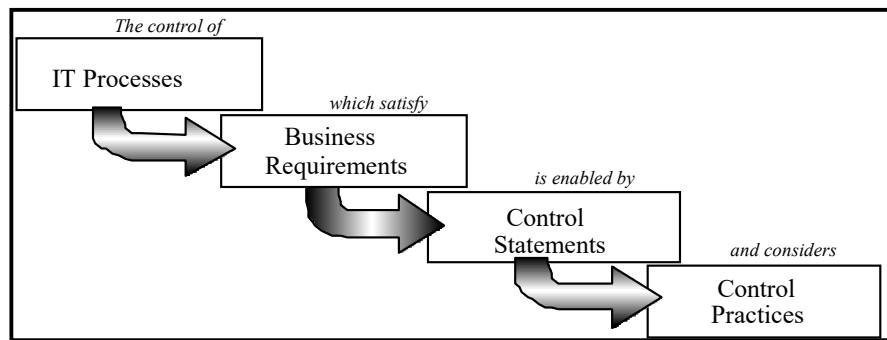


Figure 1. Information Technology Processes

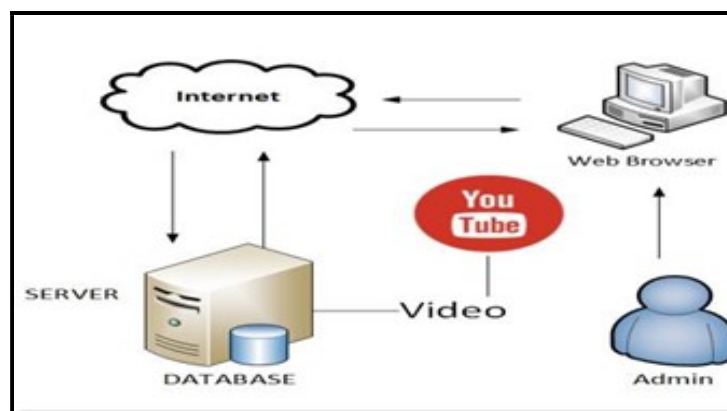


Figure 2. Design System Citizen Journalism Application



Figure 3. Login Form Application




